SIKEN, A LOOK **OVER NEW YORK**

A show at Artlife by one of the most interesting visual artists of today

It goes until March 15 at the Artlife Gallery of Calle Miracoli in Venice, The show of recent works by the New York, artist and photographer, Scott Siken, titled "Endangered Species and Transformation - Street Scenes/ Fire/Waterscapes".

Siken, creates sumie brush drawings, is a sculptor, and a photographer. At his first show in Italy, a series of photos he presents have

different themes and subjects. From the "social" street photography, to political portraits, to sea views, this is an appealing series of images with strong iconographic power, expressing the aesthetic search and struggle of one of the most interesting New York artists.

"The theme of this series of images" he states "is the endangerment of the human race and its possibility of transformation. We humans are a part of nature, but we are damaging it, and we are altering the rhythms, and the seasons. Even the essential air we breathe is being damaged in a senseless self-destruction. All the images of these four series are photographic.

Each piece is a unique signed work of original art. There are no digital images, digital elaboration, or results obtained through techniques like Photoshop. The entire developing process of the film is to create poignant images and transmit" the emotional aspects of the photograph.

The artist has already had expositions in public spaces, like the San Francisco Museum of Modern Art, the Los Angeles Institute of Contemporary Art, the New **Orleans Contemporary** Art Center, and, in Europe, among others, the Stedjelik Museum in Belgium, his works are also present in important private art collections like Saatchi & Saatchi.
